Course Description:

Learn to embroider your own Herdwick sheep or Tup from an expert, using a range of Goldwork techniques. You will be working directly onto British boiled wool and at the end of the session will be familiar with the application and limitations of working with metallic thread whilst creating a stylish, environmentally friendly cherrystone heat pad.

All levels of stitchers are welcome, for this inclusive and relaxing workshop. The kit you will receive comes with everything you need to finish your embroidered heat bag.
